Women's Art Museum of Canada Musée d'art de la femme du Canada

The Women's Art Museum of Canada (WAM) / Musée d'art de la femme du Canada (MAF) was established on October 2, 2006 with a mandate to preserve the visual heritage of Canadian women. Our primary goal was to open a museum that would house a collection of women's artworks. This was realized on a small scale October 2, 2015 when we secured an 8.73 sq. meters (93.97 sq. ft.) space in Edmonton's La Cité francophone. Eighty percent of this space functions as a micro public museum, featuring Canadian women's artworks, a small resource section, our very own archives of work done over the past 10 years and semi-permanent exhibits. The museum recently acquired a Margaret Chappelle (1915-1992) oil sketch, a beginning to the museum's permanent collection.

With this concretization, the museum initiated a dialogue with the arts community, promoting the importance of women visual artists and addressing the issue of the lack of space and presence for these artists in traditional arts museums. A feminine cultural perspective can only enrich our communities. And, for women to find their rightful place in history, an increase in visibility for their current and past artistic achievements are the necessary building blocks to equitable representation. When the museum promotes the works and artistic successes of women artists as well as documents and preserves their artistic achievements, we make a vital part of history available and accessible to the public.

There is still much work to be done. Our future plans for the museum involve the development of workshops and networking opportunities for women artists that can promote and enhance their artistic careers, a study to determine what visual assets should be part of our future museum collection, and the development of interactive activities and opportunities between our younger artists and senior ones, a mutual sharing of experiences.

The Kitchen Sync / Little Kitchens

This lip sync contest was the brain child of WAM's Vice-President, Noemi LoPinto, with WAM's Secretary, Marlena Wyman making the connection to the kitchen that could be developed two-fold, as a contest and a museum exhibit. Nine contestants bravely volunteered to lip sync: twenty-six women responded with their artistic interpretation of the kitchen. Each contestant and participant brings a unique perspective on gender boundaries and the feminine perspective that is too often overlooked.

Both *The Kitchen Sync* and *Little Kitchens* pushed boundaries for what the WAM Development Team conceived as fundraisers in our sector and themes for women artists. Both are concepts that offer public approachability. They challenge women to imagine their roles and interactions within gender defined spaces.

WAM / MAF is very grateful to all the participants of *The Kitchen Sync* and all the artists of *Little Kitchens* who took up the challenge of the kitchen to bring it to a whole new level for themselves and the museum. We look forward to next year's fundraiser, when we challenge our local celebrities to *Let's SYNC Again*.
